You are **required** to have your bike inspected by a certified bike shop. You must bring this sheet with you when you drop off your bike for inspection and have it SIGNED and STAMPED by the bicycle mechanic.



The American Lung Association recommends you tune-up your bike in early spring for training, then do your inspection. The sponsoring bike shops for the Trek Across Maine will begin offering free bike inspections to registered trekkers after April 1, 2017.

## **HELMET**

The Trek Across Maine requires all participants to wear a helmet while cycling. Helmets should be no more than five years old and need to fit properly. Do the "Eyes, Ears, Mouth Test" each time you go cycling.

TREKKER NUMBER

- O **Eyes.** Looking up past your eyebrows, you should see the very edge of the helmet.
- O **Ears.** The straps should meet right under your earlobes.
- O Mouth. When buckled, the strap should be loose enough so you can breathe and insert two fingers between it and your chin, but tight enough that if you drop your jaw you can feel the helmet pull down on the top of your head.
